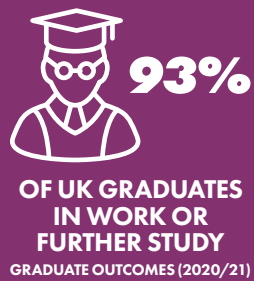
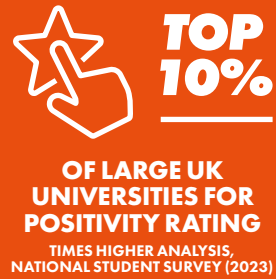

The Salam Scholarships – Overview

The Salam Scholarships have been established to support Palestinian women to study at Ulster University.

They aim to provide opportunities for Palestinian women with ability and potential, but limited opportunity, to access Ulster University courses.

The programme will provide students and young professionals with educational and training opportunities that will help their career development, enabling them to achieve impact in their chosen fields.

For the academic year 2024/25, they will support four women starting their course in September 2024.

The scholarships will support

- 1 x Undergraduate student
- 1 x Master's student
- 2 x PhD

NB For the academic years 2025/26, 2026/27, 2027/28, 2028/29, they will support five women starting their course in September 2025.

The scholarships will support

- 1 x Undergraduate student
- 1 x MBBS student (graduate entry medicine)
- 1 x Master's student
- 2 x PhD

The scholarships will cover

- Full tuition fees
- Full costs of accommodation
- One return flight home for each year of study
- A stipend to cover living costs (an example stipend for 2024/25 students might be approximately £2,500 per annum)

Eligibility

In order to apply applicants must:

- Be a female Palestinian currently resident in the occupied Palestinian territory, holding a Palestinian or Jerusalem ID. Priority will be given to residents in the West Bank, Gaza or one of the Palestinian Refugee Camps;
- Be able to provide certified proof of Occupied Palestinian Territories residency;
- Have applied to Ulster University for your chosen course;
- Have an international fee status classification;
- Be in financial need and unable to study abroad through the finances of your immediate family. Indicators include:
 - Families of students registered for support with the Ministry of Social Affairs;
 - Students from families with one breadwinner because the other breadwinner doesn't work, is sick (chronic disease), or deceased.
- Be applying to Ulster University to commence a new qualification and not be seeking funding for a course you have already commenced, or which will begin before scholarship awards have been notified;
- Have not already studied at a university outside the West Bank, Gaza, Israel or Lebanon;
- Not already hold a qualification at the level of course, or higher, to which you are applying at Ulster University e.g. if applying for an Undergraduate degree, you must not already have completed at a degree at the Undergraduate level;
- Be able to take up the scholarship in the academic year 2024/25.

English Language requirements

UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) requires that every student from outside the UK must show evidence of a minimum level of English language in order to be granted a UK Student Visa to study at Undergraduate or Postgraduate level unless the student is exempt.

Most of our courses require a minimum English level of IELTS 6.0 (Academic) or equivalent, with no band score under 5.5.

- Trinity ISE: Pass at level III (with a pass in each component) also meets this requirement.
- Password test is valid for one year and must be valid on the first day on semester of the course.
- We accept a wide range of alternative English language examinations and tests so please check the list of other accepted tests.
- Some of our courses ask for a higher score. It is therefore important to look at individual course requirements.
- All English language examinations must have been taken in the last two years (September 2022 or later).
- If you do not meet the English language requirement we may give you a conditional offer subject to you meeting the requirement before the commencement of the course.

Other requirements

- Satisfy UK immigration requirements;
- Demonstrate leadership potential in their chosen field or sector;
- Provide an explanation of how their studies will enable them to contribute to civic society;
- Are able to live in the UK for the duration of your course.

The primary determinants for obtaining these scholarships is based on three conditions:

- Students must meet the academic and English language entry requirements for their chosen course;
- Students must be able to demonstrate a need for financial aid to study at Ulster University;
- Students must be able to demonstrate how their course of study will benefit their future and society.

Your course choice

There are no restrictions on academic subjects but candidates must demonstrate that their subject will enable them to contribute to societal development.

You should ensure you hold the specified qualifications and academic grades required for the academic courses you intend applying for. It is your responsibility to ensure that your academic qualifications are of sufficient standard for your chosen course.

Please choose your course carefully. You will not normally be permitted to revise your choice after submission, unless a programme does not run. Applicants are therefore advised to thoroughly research their course choice. The relevance of the course to an applicant's career development and to societal development will form part of the assessment criteria.

Courses must begin no earlier than September 2024.
